



## INFORMATION ON BECOMING A PHARMACIST IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

### New Pharmacy Graduates (Other Canadian Universities)

The College welcomes graduates from other Canadian university pharmacy programs. If you've never been registered to practice pharmacy, here's what you need to do to practice as a pharmacist in BC.

- o **Step 1**            **Pre-register as an applicant with the College of Pharmacists of British Columbia**  
  
Complete the "Application for Pre-Registration – Canada – New Graduate". Allow up to 20 business days for your application to be processed.

- o **Step 2**            **Successfully complete the Jurisprudence Examination (JE).**

- o **Step 3**            **Successfully complete the Pharmacy Examining Board of Canada (PEBC) Qualifying Exam – Part I and Part II.**
