



INFORMATION ON BECOMING A PHARMACIST IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

Pharmacists applying for reinstatement in British Columbia.

Here's what you need to do to reinstate as a practicing pharmacist in B.C. Select the criteria which best describes your current status:

- Non-Practising Pharmacist Registration or Former Pharmacist for less than 90 days (Late renewal)
- Non-Practising Pharmacist Registration or Former Pharmacist for more than 90 days but less than six years
- Non-Practising Pharmacist Registration or Former Pharmacist 6 years or more

Non-Practising Pharmacist Registration or Former Pharmacist for 90 days or less (Late Renewal)

- Step 1** Complete the “Application for Reinstatement – Late Registration Renewal” and pay the late renewal fee.

- Step 2** Pay your annual registration fee.

*Note that late registration renewal can also be completed online through eServices on the College website.

Non-Practising Pharmacist Registration or Former Pharmacist for more than 90 days but less than six years

- Step 1** Complete the “Application for Reinstatement (more than 90 days but less than 6 years)” and pay the reinstatement fee (and PDAP KA fee, if applicable)

Allow up to 20 business days for your application to be processed

- Step 2** Successfully meet the requirements of the Professional Development and Assessment Program (PDAP), if applicable.

This requirement must be met prior to reinstating to the full pharmacist register. For more information, contact the College office.

Non-Practising Pharmacist Registration or Former Pharmacist for six years or more

- **Step 1** **Complete the “Application for Reinstatement – 6 years or more” and pay the reinstatement fee.**
Allow up to 20 business days for your application to be processed

- **Step 2** **Successfully complete the Jurisprudence Examination (JE)**

- **Step 3** **Successfully complete the Structured Practical Training (SPT) program**
