



INFORMATION ON BECOMING A PHARMACIST IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

New Pharmacy Graduates (US Universities)

The College welcomes graduates from US university pharmacy programs. If you've never been registered to practice pharmacy, here's what you need to do to practice as a pharmacist in BC.

- **Step 1** **Pre-register as an applicant with the College of Pharmacists of British Columbia**

Complete the “Application for Pre-Registration – USA – New Graduate”. Allow up to 20 business days for your application to be processed.

- **Step 2** **Successfully complete the Jurisprudence Examination (JE).**

- **Step 3** **Successfully complete the Pharmacy Examining Board of Canada (PEBC) Qualifying Exam – Part I and Part II.**

You have now completed all the steps necessary to become a pharmacist registered to practise in BC. The College will issue a Certificate of Registration and annual registration card designed to be carried in your wallet. You will need to renew your registration once a year.

* If you have not graduated from an Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE) accredited university in the continental U.S., you will be required to complete the **English Language Proficiency (ELP) requirements** and the **Structured Practical Training (SPT) program** prior to applying for Full Pharmacist registration.
