The Eyhh Slaxin (Good Medicine) Line is a dedicated phone line for Indigenous individuals to speak directly with the College of Pharmacists of British Columbia (CPBC) about concerns related to pharmacy care experiences in B.C.

*Eyhh Slaxin* means Good Medicine — reflecting an approach grounded in respect, care, and responsibility.

- A respectful starting point for moving toward addressing your concerns

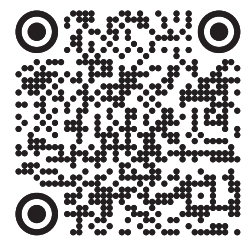
